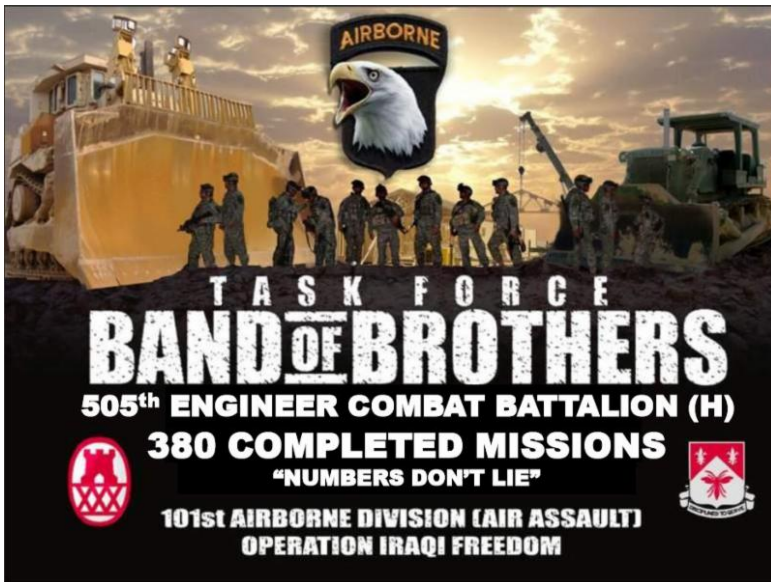

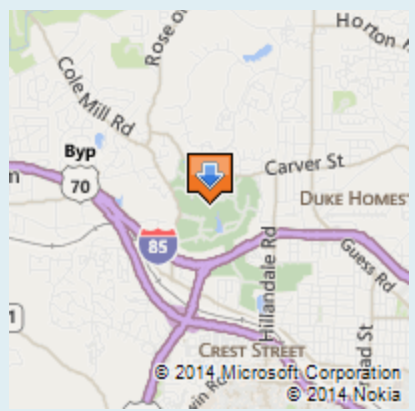

Engineering from the William States Lee College of Engineering at UNC-Charlotte in 2001. His military schools include Airborne, Engineer Officer Basic, Engineer Captain's Career Course, Command and General Staff Officer Course Phase I, II and III.

Shortly after receiving his commission in 2001, he was assigned to the rear detachment for Bravo Co. 505th EN BN in Forest City, NC as a platoon leader. He served as Platoon Leader to the 211th Military Police Company when they deployed to Iraq in 2003. During 2005-2006, he served as Bravo Company's Executive and Construction Officer during his second deployment in Operation Iraqi Freedom IV. Upon returning from Iraq, he became the Company Commander of HHC 505th EN BN, Gastonia, and helped transition the company from a legacy organization into the modular unit of today. In 2009, he was given command of the 875th (Horizontal) EN Co, located in North Wilkesboro, NC, where he led them as they constructed the Rankin Lake Range Support Facilities, Mooresville YMCA Soccer Complex and a California road construction mission. He is currently employed in the Construction and Facilities Management Office of the North Carolina National Guard as the Director of Design and Project Management, and the 505th Engineer Battalion Operations Officer.

Among MAJ Caldwell's awards and decorations are the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters, National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with 1 Campaign Star, Iraq Campaign Medal with 3 Campaign Stars, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and the Bronze de Fleury Medal.
