



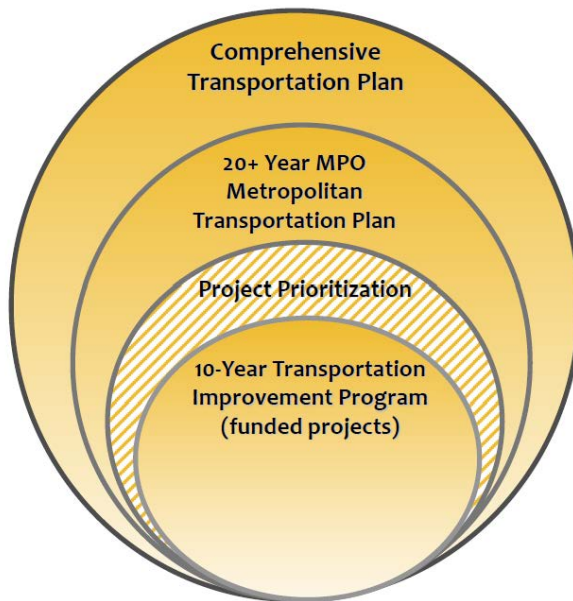

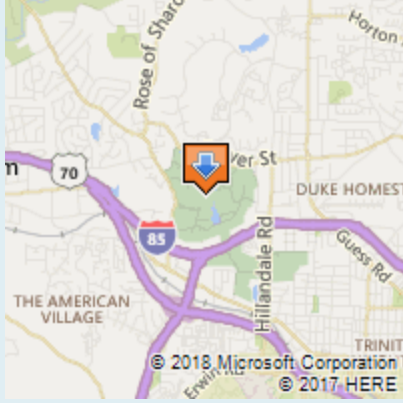

many times the final product is a set of highway, transit and other maps. However, the reality is that the needed demographic and transportation forecasting and modeling, fiscal analysis, agency coordination and public input process require great effort and organization. The Durham-Chapel Hill Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) is responsible for the federal long-range planning in the Durham area. The DCHC MPO long-range plans commonly require two to four years to complete. Why so long? We will discuss the multiple processes and complex tools, e.g., demographic and transportation modeling, used by the DCHC MPO to produce the transportation plans in the Durham area.

Andy Henry has been a transportation planner for the Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) since 2002. He is responsible for the long-range transportation plans, collector street and corridor plans, socio-economic forecasts, and several specialized planning projects. Prior to his DCHC MPO work, he provided consulting to rural transit systems as a Research Associate at the Institute for Transportation Research and Education (ITRE), and was the planner for the Guilford County rural and human service transportation system. Andy has a Masters of Regional Planning degree from the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill.
